

Logan County Transit Development Plan



Following the loss of public transit service in early 2025, Bridges Community Action Partnership (CAP), through the ODOT Transit Development Plan (TDP) process, is planning for the restoration of public transportation in Logan County. Based on analysis of community transportation needs, previous transit service, and extensive public and stakeholder input, this document outlines the TDP's phased approach to restoring and eventually expanding service as funding, vehicles, and operational capacity become available.

Service Design

Community input has been a key part of the process, including feedback from 27 local stakeholders and 206 community survey responses, helping identify travel needs and priorities for future transit improvements. The top priority for the first year of service is to fully restore Countywide Demand Response coverage and includes options for additional service expansion in the future.

September 2026

Bridges to work with ODOT to apply for funding, procure transit vehicles, hire staff, and prepare for service launch.

July 2027

Countywide Demand Response service begins. Service will be introduced in phases as vehicles are procured and staff are trained.

January 2028

Countywide Demand Response service fully launches.

July 2028

As funding allows, Bridges will explore additional service expansion for Countywide Demand Response, and possible on-demand transportation in Indian Lake and Bellefontaine.

Countywide Demand Response



A ride you reserve ahead of time (at least 24 hours in advance). Instead of following a fixed route, the vehicle travels based on rider requests within Logan County.



Would serve all of Logan County and would be available to the general public.



Service schedule updated to run 5:30 AM –8:00 PM, Monday through Friday,

On-Demand Service Expansion



A shared-ride service that can be requested by phone or mobile app to travel within around a specific area (for example Indian Lake or Bellefontaine).



Would serve the general public within the designated dropoff/pickup zones.



Service schedule would be the same as Countywide Demand Response: 5:30 AM –8:00 PM, Monday through Friday.
